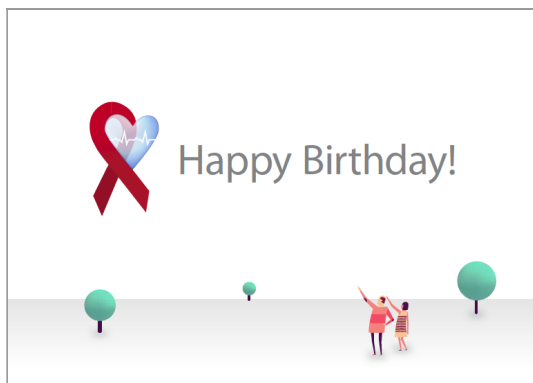
## Randomized Trial to Prevent Vascular Events in HIV

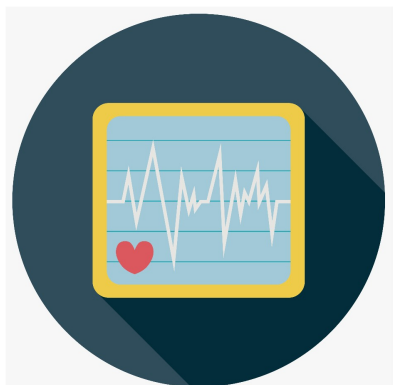
The timeline below lists important tasks and deadlines for the upcoming Data and Safety Monitoring Board (DSMB) review of the REPRIEVE trial.

Please mark these important dates in your calendar and note that Friday, May 31st is the deadline to respond to last minute outstanding queries.

Sites	Last date for the occurrence of an evaluation for which complete data will be included in this DSMB review	April 22 <sup>nd</sup> (Monday)
Sites	All data for visits through April 22 <sup>nd</sup> entered	Apr 29 <sup>th</sup> (Monday)
Sites	All adjudication packets for potential MACE events with a work-up complete by April 22 <sup>nd</sup> submitted to DCC (MGH)**	May 3 <sup>rd</sup> (Friday)
Sites	All outstanding queries resolved	May 13 <sup>th</sup> (Monday)
Sites	Respond to last minute outstanding queries	May 31 <sup>st</sup> (Friday)
	DSMB Meeting	June 24 <sup>th</sup> (Monday)

\*Deadlines are Close of Business on the given date unless otherwise noted.

\*\*Please ensure that you have responded to all queries and clarifications from the DCC regarding source documents submitted for potential adjudicated events. This will ensure that the DCC is able to submit complete packets to TIMI for adjudication prior to the DSMB.



### Important Reminder About ECG Machines

**THANK YOU** to every site that has already returned their ECG machine to IQVIA! Over 70 machines have been returned so far.

**For sites that have not yet returned their REPRIEVE (A5332) ECG machine:**

- All sites should have received an email from IQVIA Machine Logistics with an airway bill (AWB) and instructions to return the machine. If you have not received this email please email [kfitch@partners.org](mailto:kfitch@partners.org) as soon as possible.
- Sites have 60 days from the receipt of the 1st retrieval email to return the machine, the CCC will be charged for any ECG machines not returned within this time.

Since there are no changes to A5333s, DAIDS has confirmed that a protocol-specific signature page is not required for A5333s for Version 5.0.

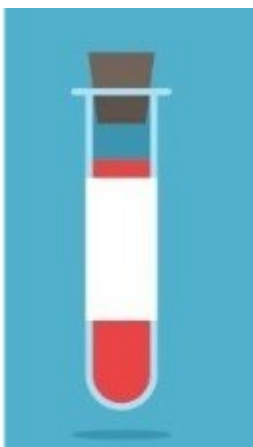


## TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES
