The timeline below lists important tasks and deadlines for the upcoming Data and Safety Monitoring Board (DSMB) review of the REPRIEVE trial. Please mark these dates on your calendar and note that Monday, October 21st, is the data entry deadline.

Report Potential Adjudicated Events

One essential task we don't want sites to forget is to identify and report potential adjudicated events!



Adjudicated Events in REPRIEVE are:

- Atherosclerotic or other CVD death
- Nonfatal myocardial infarction
- Unstable angina hospitalization
- · Coronary or peripheral arterial revascularization

^{**} Please ensure that you have responded to all queries and clarifications from the DCC regarding source documents submitted for potential adjudicated events. This will ensure that the DCC is able to submit complete packets to TIMI for adjudication prior to the DSMB.

- Peripheral arterial ischemia
- Nonfatal stroke or transient ischemic attack (TIA)
- Heart failure
- Death from any cause

Important steps in identifying and reporting adjudicated events include:

- Take a thorough history from the participant and review the medical record to identify any potential adjudicated events.
- Ensure that the Heart-Related Health Questionnaire has been completed and is kept with source documents
- Ensure that 100% of Adjudicated Event Tracking CRFs have been completed accurately and necessary steps have been taken to submit any potential events for adjudication as per section 6.0 of the REPRIEVE (A5332) MOPS.

If your site submits a packet for a potential adjudicated event, please make sure that the Site PI or their desginee reviews the packet and agrees with the content before it is submitted to the REPRIEVE Data Coordinating Center.



Introducing Gerald (Jerry) Bloomfield, MD, MPH, and REPRIEVE Cardiologist!

Dr. Gerald (Jerry) S. Bloomfield is an Associate Professor of Medicine and Global Health at Duke University. Dr. Bloomfield's research interests are in the epidemiology, treatment and prevention of cardiovascular diseases domestically and in the global health context. He is particularly focused on heart failure and HIV-associated cardiovascular diseases, where he studies the application of ultrasound imaging to detect and predict myocardial dysfunction in people living with HIV. Bloomfield has lived and worked in Kenya intermittently since 2003 where he has led studies of heart failure epidemiology, cardiovascular effects of indoor air pollution, genetic associations with cardiac arrhythmias and cardiovascular disease risk factors among people living with HIV.

Reminder About Timing of Vaccinations

With flu season approaching in the Northern Hemisphere, remember that sites may administer vaccinations on the same day as REPRIEVE study visits, but please do so after any blood to be banked has been drawn.

Participant moving? Transfer REPRIEVE participants to nearby sites!

Given the duration of REPRIEVE, it is likely one or more of your participants may move out of the area. REPRIEVE has sites in nearly every state in the US and in 11 countries around the world! So if one of your REPRIEVE participants is moving, chances are there is another site nearby! Click here to find a map of our clinical sites.

REPRIEVE follows <u>SOP ACTG-119</u>, <u>Study Participant Transfer</u> for paricipant transfers, however specific protocol guidance can be found in section 12.5 of the REPRIEVE (A5332) MOPs.
