In a recent JAMA commentary Dr. Anthony Fauci, Director of NIAID, highlights the lingering challenge of comorbidities in people with HIV.

"To effectively solve the global health crisis HIV represents, the comorbidities among persons currently living with HIV must be addressed...successfully addressing the comorbidities will require new research advances...In this regard, a large ongoing clinical study, REPRIEVE, is investigating whether statin administraton can reduce the incidence of major cardiovascular events in persons with HIV."
